Buckle up, because 2024 has been a buzzing year for us—think busy bees with megaphones! We've been on a mission to amplify women's voices, spark policy changes, and equip champions of gender equality right across Africa.

## Here's the sweet scoop on what we've stirred up this year:

A Pan-African Reach- In just 12 short months, we connected, supported and worked with women and girls from 38 countries spanning all 5 African subregions and the 6th region Diaspora —our hive of influence has truly gone continental!

We have helped pollinate the African feminist ecosystem with USD 1,083,184 in Flexible Feminist Funds to 21 Women's Rights Organizations in the continent.

We directly supported, collectively co-created, co-conspired and strategised with over 480 Women's Rights Organizations and Civil Society Organizations with the tools, playbooks and partnerships needed to advance gender equality and women's rights. And we didn't stop there: more than 250 women and girls received capacity strengthening in our thematic areas of <u>Transformative Women's Leadership</u>, <u>Economic Justice and Rights</u>, <u>Advancing Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), Ending Violence</u> <u>Against Women and Girls, Climate Justice and Natural Resource</u>

The continent was abuzz with **Beijing+ 30 Review** – <u>Uniting in Solidarity</u>, <u>Safeguarding our Gains</u>, <u>Amplifying our Voices</u> we facilitated **5 sub-regional consultations** and **4 regional in -person consultations** in **Ghana**, **Mozambique**, **Kenya** and **Cameroon** while also hosting **5 youth consultations**. In total, these processes directly reached **1,328 participants** ensuring diverse voices—especially those of young people—directly shaping policy recommendations, regional priorities, and advocacy strategies for a more equitable and gender-just future in Africa.

At Africa Disrupt CSW68, we rallied 139 women and girls to advocate for policies that don't just preserve past wins but propel us even further toward gender equality. Their demands are now on the radar for CSW69–watch this space

Over **280 women and girls** engaged in key advocacy spaces—**AU Summits, the Africa Regional Forum on Sustainable Development, Reproductive Health Conferences, the Human Rights Council, CoP 29, CSW 69, IAFFE Annual Conference, the Summit of the Future, the High-Level Political Forum**—making sure the needs and dreams of African women and girls took center stage.

We celebrated policy wins, both big and small! From the local to the regional level, we backed Women's Rights Organizations pushing for transformative policies. In Kisumu County, Kenya, we helped shape a <u>Technical Vocational</u> <u>Education Training Policy</u> that's set to keep girls and young women thriving in vocational training.



We established 15-member youth а sounding board in Kenya guide to European Union in Kenya programmingbecause who better to knows what young people need than people young themselves? We championed the Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child & Adolescent Health (RMCAH) Siaya Bill, laying the groundwork for healthier futures.
